### All verbs

When **did** I **compete**?  
**Did** you **throw** the javelin?  
**Did** he **wear** shoes?  
**Did** she **do** running?  
 When **did** it **start**?  
**Did** we **get** an olive wreath?  
 Why **did** you **come** here?  
**Did** they **compete** naked?

### Verb to be

**Was** I rude last night?  
 When **were** you at the Olympics?  
**Was** he the best athlete in 2012?  
**Was** she the winner?  
**Was** it one of the original events?  
**Were** we good at skating then?  
 Why **were** you out last night?  
**Were** they naked?

### Verb can

**Could** I talk when I was two?  
**Could** you read when you were five?  
**Could** he play tennis well?  
**Could** she drive two years ago?  
**Could** it complete the race?  
**Could** we speak English then?  
**Could** you go out last night?  
**Could** they compete?

- We use the **Simple Past interrogative** form to ask questions about single actions completed in the past.

## UNIT 8 Contrast of Present and Past tenses

### Simple Present

I **watch** the Olympics every four years.  
You often **win** competitions.  
He **lives** in a flat in the city centre.  
She **is** a famous Olympic athlete.  
It **is** a swimming centre now.  
We **are** ready to go.  
You **can't** use mobile phones here.  
They **can** compete in the modern Olympics.

### Simple Past

I **watched** the Olympics last year.  
You **won** a silver medal in 2012.  
He **lived** in a house when he was a child.  
She **was** the best athlete in the 2004 Olympics.  
It **was** a rubbish tip before the Olympics.  
We **weren't** ready when you called us.  
You **couldn't** use mobile phones here last week.  
They **couldn't** compete in the ancient Olympics.

- We use the **Simple Present** to talk about actions that are repeated or regular facts, habits and general truths. We use the **Simple Past** to talk about actions completed at a specific time in the past.

There are some time expressions that help us distinguish if a sentence is in the present or in the past:

Present: *now, nowadays, every day/week/year, usually, in modern times...*

Past: *yesterday, last week/year, in 2014, ten years ago, in ancient times...*
