

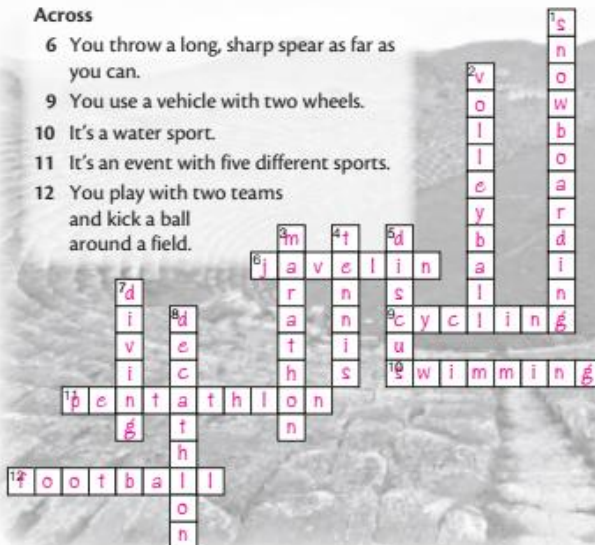

1 Chionis of Sparta was the most incredible athlete of his time. He was the long jump champion. The records say that he once jumped 7.05 m. Even for today, that is an extraordinary jump. It was the world record until 1901!

2 Herodorus of Megara was the champion trumpeter. In the ancient Olympics they also competed in other types of events like music and poetry. Herodorus won the trumpet competition nine times. Sometimes he played two trumpets at the same time.

3 Astylos of Croton was the champion of the hoplite event. This was a very difficult race. The athletes ran wearing full armour and helmets.

4 Milo of Croton was a champion wrestler and he won six titles and his career lasted for 30 years. He was famous for being incredibly strong. He ate more than eight kilos of meat every day! He was also a musician and a poet, and he studied Maths and Philosophy.

5 Aegeus of Argos was a famous long distance runner. After he won the title in Olympia in 328 BC he ran all the way back to Argos to bring the good news, without stopping even once. That is a distance of more than 130 kilometres!

6 Kynisca of Sparta was King Archidamos' daughter. She was the first woman to win at the ancient Olympic games. Women could only compete in the chariot races. Kynisca won this event twice in 396 and 392 BC.

7 Phayllos of Croton was a champion pentathlon athlete. His specialty was the discus and his best throw was about 43 metres. This throw was so good it is recorded in the ancient Olympic records and was still the world record in the first modern Olympics!
