REGULAR AND IRREGULAR VERBS IN THE PAST SIMPLE.

Affirmative	Negative	Interrogative
I arrived/ came back late.	I didn't arrive/come back late.	Did I arrive/come back late?
You believed/ heard it.	You didn't believe/hear it.	Did you believe/hear it?
He lived/ grew well.	He didn't live/grow well.	Did he live/grow well?
She died/ fought .	She didn't die/fight.	Did she die/fight?
It disappeared/ ran away.	It didn't disappear/run away.	Did it disappear/run away?
We started/ built it.	We didn't start/build it.	Did we start/build it?
You hunted/ saw a wolf.	You didn't hunt/see a wolf.	Did you hunt/see a wolf?
They attacked/ caught the sheep.	They didn't attack/catch the sheep.	Did they attack/catch the sheep?

- We use the **Past Simple** to talk about habits, single actions and states in the past. Irregular verbs have their own forms in the Past Simple affirmative, which we should learn by heart: *come – came, find – found, give – gave*, etc.

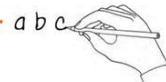

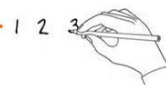
