Past simple

Remember!

For regular verbs, we add -ed. For irregular verbs, there is a special past tense form. regular verbs: play - played, watch - watched, want - wanted irregular verbs: eat - ate, write - wrote, go - went

Be careful!

When we use the negative, we don't change the main verb. We use 'didn't' instead.

I didn't watch TV.

I didn't go to school.

We say... We don't say...

I had fun! (NOT I haved fun!)
He didn't play tennis. (NOT He didn't played tennis.)
They went to France. (NOT They wented to France.)



eat – ate, write – wrote, go – went For the negative, don't change the main verb. Use 'didn't' instead: play – didn't play, eat – didn't eat
